

Atfal-ul-Ahmadiyya Essay competition – 1st Place

Topic: Rights of Women in Islam

Women in Islam are thought to be dominated, corrupted, worried – but are they really? Are millions of Muslims simply that cruel or are these errors fake by a biased media?

Over fourteen hundred years ago, Islam gave women rights that women in the West have only recently began to enjoy. In the 1930's, Annie Besant observed, "It is only in the last twenty

Divorced women remain in waiting for three periods, and it is not lawful for them to conceal what Allah has created in their wombs if they believe in Allah and the Last Day. And their husbands have more right to take them back in this [period] if they want reconciliation. And due to the wives is similar to what is expected of them, according to what is reasonable. But the men have a degree over them [in responsibility and authority]. And Allah is Exalted in Might and Wise.

The Holy Qur'an 2:228

years that Christian England has recognized the right of woman to property, while Islam has allowed this right from all times. It is a slander to say that Islam preaches that women have no souls. Men and women all descended from a single person – the Prophet Adam (peace be upon him). Islam does not accept for either of them anything but justice and kind treatment.

Men and women worship Allah (God) in the same way. Meaning they worship the same God (Allah), emphasises the just treatment and reward due to both men and women in many verses of the Qur'an: perform the same acts of worship, follow the same scripture, and hold the same beliefs. Allah (the Arabic word for the One True God of all creation), judges all human beings fairly and honestly.

"Allah has promised to the believers, men and women, gardens under which rivers flow, to do well there in, and beautiful mansions in gardens of everlasting happiness."

The Holy Qur'an 9:72.

"Never will I allow the loss of the work of any worker amongst you, male or female; you are of one another."

The Holy Qur'an 3:195.

These verses show that reward is dependent upon one's actions and not one's gender. Gender does not play any part in how a person is rewarded and judged.

If we compare Islam to other religions, we see that it offers justice between the genders. For example, Islam dismisses the idea that Eve is more to blame than Adam for eating from the forbidden tree. According to

Islam, Adam and Eve both sinned, they both repented and God forgave them both.

Islam has honoured women by giving them the right to choose a spouse and keep their original family name once married. Additionally, many have the impression that parents force their daughters into marriage. This is a cultural practice, and has no basis in Islam. In fact, it is prohibited.

God created men and women to be different, with unique roles, skills and responsibilities. These differences are not viewed as evidences of superiority or inferiority, but of specialization. In Islam, the family is of central importance. The man is responsible for the financial wellbeing of the family while the woman contributes to the family's physical, educational and emotional wellbeing. This encourages cooperation rather than competition. By fulfilling their mutual responsibilities, strong families are created and hence strong societies.

While men and women have equal rights as a general principle, the specific rights and responsibilities granted to them are not identical. Men and women have complementary rights and responsibilities. In those days before Islam, women were

treated like slaves or property. Their personal consent concerning anything related to their well-being was considered unimportant, to such a degree that they were never even treated as a party to a marriage contract.

Women were used for one purpose, and then discarded. They had no independence, could own no property and were not allowed to inherit. In times of war, women were treated as part of the prize. Simply put, their condition was unspeakable.

In addition, the birth of a daughter in a family was not an occasion for rejoicing, but was regarded with humiliation. The practice of killing female children was uncontrolled.

Muslim woman is not permitted to change her family name to her husband's name upon marriage. She is always known by her father's name, as a mark of her own identity. In choosing a marriage partner, her consent to accept or reject any prospective suitor for marriage must be respected. A Muslim woman has the right to seek divorce, if necessary within the laws of Islam.

In the West, women may be doing the

same job that men do, but their wages are often less. The rights of Western women in modern times were not created voluntarily, or out of kindness to the female. The modern Western woman reached her present position by force, and not through natural processes or mutual consent of Divine teachings. She had to force her way, and various circumstances aided her. Shortage of manpower during wars, pressure of economic needs and requirement of industry forced women to leave their homes to work, struggling for their livelihood, to appear equal to men. Whether all women are sincerely pleased with these circumstances, and whether they are happy and satisfied with the results, is a different matter. But the fact remains that whatever rights modern Western women have, they fall short of those of her Muslim counterpart! Islam has given woman what duties her female nature. It gives her full security and protects her against becoming what Western modern women themselves complain against: a "mere gender object."

May Allah bless us with the teachings of women in Islam.

The divine scheme of regulation of relationship between males and females, Islam has assigned a position of dignity and honour to woman. This regulation is essential for peace, comfort, happiness and continuation of the species. The Holy Quran emphasizes that God the almighty created all species in pairs as He said in Holy Quran:-

'He created you from a single being; then of the same kind made its mate' (39:7).

Over fourteen hundred years ago, Islam gave women the rights which western women are now getting some of it and still struggling for others. Now we look into the rights which women have in Islam.

Worship and its reward

In Islam, women worship in the same way as men does, they worship the same God, perform the same acts in worship, follow and read the same scripture and have the same beliefs. Allah says in Holy Quran:-

Mailis: Penrith, NSW

"And the believers, men and women, are friends one of other. They enjoin good and forbid evil and observe prayer and pay Zakat and obey Allah and His Messenger. It is these on whom Allah will have mercy. Surely, Allah is Mighty, Wise." (9:71).

Also the Holy Quran has made it absolutely clear that reward in the life after death and nearness to God, not depend upon gender but upon their faith and deeds. As mention in Quran:

"Allah has promised to believers, men and women, Gardens beneath which rivers flow, wherein they will abide, and delightful dwelling places in Gardens of Eternity. And the pleasure of Allah is the greatest of all. That is the supreme triumph." (9:72)

Hazrat Maryam (Mother of Jesus^{as}) was a pious woman in history. The Quran says that she had attained such

an elevated spiritual degree that the angel used to visit her in her prayer and converse with her. She had attained a high position of Divine.

EducationIslam are encouraged to seek knowledge to both male and female and there is no limitation to gender or age. Allah encourages women to read and keep up the learning process. He also bestows His mercy upon all who seek knowledge, and gives them high staus. As mention in Quran:-

"Exalted then is Allah, the True King! And be not impatient for the Quran ere its revelation is completed unto thee, but only say, Ó my Lord, increase me in knowledge." (20:115). The Holy Prophet (Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him) said: "To seek knowledge is compulsory on every Muslim."

Marriage

Islam also gave woman the right to choose her partner. She has a right to say yes or reject the proposal and guardian should respect her opinion. Also a Muslim woman has a right to seek divorce, if it is necessary. At the time of the Holy Prophet^(Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him) a woman came up to him and said 'My father married me to my cousin to raise his social standings and I was

forced into it." The Prophet(Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him) sent for the girl's father and then in his presence gave the girl option of remaining married or nullifying the marriage. She responded, "O Messenger of Allah, I have accepted what my father did, but I wanted to show other women."

Inheritance

Islam gave women a share in the inheritance over fourteen hundred years ago, hence in western society it is recognised in 1930's. Allah says in the Holy Quran: "For men is a share of that which parents and near relations leave; and for women is a share of that which parents and near relations leave. Whether it be little or much—a determined share." (4:8) However women have equal rights in as a general principal but they are assigned different roles and duties in daily life because they are different to each other in their strength and abilities.

A socio-biology expert, Edward O. Wilson of Harvard University, said that females tend to be higher than males in verbal skills, empathy and social skills, among other things, while men tend to be higher in independence, dominance and mathematical skills. So it would be

foolish to treat both of them same.

Islam teaches us that men and women have complementary, yet different roles. Allah says it beautifully in Holy Quran:-

"They are a garment for you and you are a garment for them." (2:188)

In Islam, woman has very honoured and respectful status as a mother and daughter. A mother has the greatest influence on a child especially in the earlier years through her affection, care and love. Allah says in the holy Quran: - "And we have enjoined on man to be good to his parents. His mother bears him with pain, and brings him forth with pain. And the bearing of him and his weaning takes thirty months, till when he attains his full maturity and reaches the age of forty years, he says 'My Lord, grant me the power that I may be grateful for thy flavour which thou hast bestowed upon me and upon my parents." (46:15).

The Prophet (Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him) was once asked,

"O Messenger of Allah, who among people is most deserving of my good treatment?" He said, your mother the man asked twice more, then who and was given the same response your mother. Only until the fourth time did the Prophet(Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him)

respond your father.

Islam is not only reward the good and kind treatment towards mother but also has designated a special reward for raising daughters. The Prophet(Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him) said "Whoever Allah has given two daughters and is kind towards them, they will be a reason for him entering paradise."

Before Islam, women were considered shameful, female children were buried alive and treated like a slave. Islam came and abolished these practices and granted women honour, respect and dignity. Islam regards a woman as precious and valuable person. Allah says:-

"Surely, men who submit themselves to God and women who submit themselves to him, and believing men and believing women, and obedient men and obedient women and truthful men and truthful women, and men steadfast in their faith and steadfast women, and men who are humble and women who are humble, and men who give alms and women who give alms, and men who fast and women who fast, and men who guard their chastity and women who remember Allah much and women who remember Him — Allah has prepared for all of them forgiveness and a great reward." (33:36).

Topic: Rights of Women in Islam

Women in Islam are honoured, given great importance and respect. This rule is very important for peace, happiness and progress of the human race. The Holy Quran has highlighted that Allah has created every species in pairs. This shows that men and women in Islam are equal and have the same rights as one another.

At the time of the Holy Prophet^(Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him) women were greatly disrespected and dishonoured. Women had no rights and no laws to protect themselves from the doings of immoral men. Some examples that clearly show that women were regarded merely as an object are the following: they were not allowed any share of their father's or husband's property. Their husband's owned them and were given their wives as property. A woman had no right over her children. Women were deprived

of love and affection from their parents, meaning that parents showed love more to boys than to girls. Woman in the time of the Holy Prophet (Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him) was disrespected so much, that some families even buried their newly born daughters alive at birth. These examples of the disregard towards women clearly show that a woman was merely looked upon as an object.

Women and men in Islam are both spiritually equal and will be given the same great reward by Allah if they perform the qualities which he has asked of them. This means that both men and women are asked of the same things by Allah, and by doing these they both gain the same great reward. Evidence of this is shown in the Holy Quran as following: "For men who submit themselves wholly to Allah, and women who submit themselves wholly to Him and men who believe and women who believe,

and men who obey Allah and women who obey Him, and men who are truthful and women who are truthful, and men who are steadfast and women who are steadfast, and men who are humble, and men who give alms and women who give alms, and men who fast and women who fast, and men who guard their chastity and women who remember Allah much and women who remember Him,

women who remember Him, Allah has prepared forgiveness and a great reward" (33:36). This proves that on the topic of spiritual equality, men and women both have the same rights.

Men and women are also equal in Islam in intellect. This means that both men and women are told to acquire as much knowledge as they can, and Islam stresses the need for an education for both genders. This is shown through a saying of the Holy Prophet(Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him), "It is the duty of every Muslim man and every Muslim woman to acquire knowledge". This saying is very easy to understand and tells us to try our hardest to gain knowledge. Another example that shows us the importance of knowledge is in the Holy Quran where it says: "He grants wisdom to whom

He pleases, and whoever is granted wisdom has indeed been granted abundant good; and none would take heed except those endowed with understanding" (2:270). These two examples are clear evidence to support that Islam teaches both men and women to acquire knowledge and in this sense, they are equal.

Mother's in Islam are given great honour and status. Obedience and love to parents is repeatedly stressed in the Holy Quran, for example in this verse: "Worship Allah and associate naught with Him, and be benevolent towards parents" (4:37). Another verse of the Holy Quran relating to obedience to parents, especially the mother is the following: "We have enjoined upon man to act benevolently towards his parents. His mother bears him in pain and brings him forth in pain; and the bearing of him and his weaning extends over thirty months. When he attains his full maturity at forty years, he supplicates: Lord, grant me the favour that I may be grateful to Thee for the bounty that Thou hast bestowed upon me and upon my parents, and that I may act righteously so as to please Thee, and make my progeny righteous also. I do turn to Thee and truly I am of Thy obedient servants." (46:16). Further evidence is given through the sayings of the Holy Prophet(Peace &

Blessings of Allah be upon him) or Ahadith. The following saying proves the great status of mothers in Islam: "Paradise lies at the feet of your mothers." These examples from the Holy Quran and the Holy Prophet (Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him) clearly prove that the mother has an incredibly high status in Islam.

In Islam men and women are equal and have the same rights. Though at the time of the Holy Prophet (Peace & Blessings of Allah be upon him), women were disrespected, Islam teaches to respect and honour women. Women and men are spiritually and intellectually equal, and women's positions as a mother has an incredibly high status. There are also examples and evidence in the form of quranic verses sayings of the Holy Prophet (saw). All this can lead to only one conclusion, that men and women are equal in Islam.


